

Community members, staff, and volunteers receive specialized training at the Y to become certified in First Aid, CPR, Lifeguarding, and Youth Mental Health First Aid.







COMMUNITY HIGHLIGHTS

Volunteers assembled more than 500 personal hygiene kits during our annual MLK Day of Service. The kits, made with supplies donated by Y members and community partners, were distributed to families experiencing housing insecurity by Family Promise of Essex County.

We celebrated **Black History Month** with memorable community programs, including a presentation on the rich Black history right here in Montclair and a showcase of female African American leaders and changemakers.

Our friends at the West Milford Rotary Club generously donated their time and resources to create a **Pollinator Garden at our YMCA Outdoor Education Center**. The garden will be a focal point for our campers' environmental education and community programming in West Milford for many years to come.

We were honored to welcome **Congresswoman Mikie Sherill** for a visit to our Early Learning Center at the Geyer Family YMCA, highlighting the critical importance of high-quality, accessible childcare and early learning opportunities.

Y members celebrated the inclusive spirit of **Welcoming Week** by marking their country of heritage on our world map. Plus, we enjoyed a Taiwanese Dancy Party, a Café con Leche tasting, a "Share Your Heritage" coffee hour, and a presentation on Italian emigration to New Jersey.


