GENERAL INFORMATION

The YMCA of Montclair School Age Child Care Program is designed to provide care for children while parents are working. This program focuses on building self-confidence and character. We emphasize the Y's four core values in character development — caring, honesty, respect, and responsibility — in every activity and interaction.

When children enter one of our state-licensed Y SACC Programs, a world of growth opens up to them in a safe, fun, and enriching environment. In addition to supplementing what they learned in school, they have the opportunity to participate in a variety of structured activities, get assistance with their homework from trained YMCA staff, have a chance to socialize with their peers and form new relationships. We also see an importance of giving them some time to participate in staff-supervised free play, which is vital for their development, growth, and self-confidence.

PAYMENT POLICY

All payments are automatically drafted on the first of each month from the account entered at the time of registration.

There is a \$20 failed draft charge imposed by the credit card processor.

The School Age Child Care tuition fees are based on the number of school days, broken down to ten equal monthly installments for your convenience. The fee is not based on the number of calendar days per month, and no prorating of fees is allowed. The only exception is if beginning the month of October you enroll after the 15th of the month.

It is our policy that monthly tuition is paid in full. We do not prorate for absences or by the hour. If needed, children can withdraw for one or more months at a time. Changes or withdrawals to your child's schedule, must be submitted in writing by the 15th of the month prior to the change taking place to sacc@montclairymca.org.

STAYCATION

Working parents can register their children Kindergarten through 8th grade in the Staycation program which runs from 7:45 am to 5:45 pm during selected school holidays. Your child will enjoy a variety of activities which may include games, art, reading, swimming, STEM, cooking/nutrition, and indoor & outdoor play.

MEMBERSHIP

The School Age Care Program requires participants to have a current Y membership. The membership entitles a child, for additional fees, to participate in various programs. With a youth membership, a child may participate in open youth gym and swim times at no additional cost.

For all children who need to start the program on the first day of school — registration must be completed on or before Sunday, August 24.



EARLY REGISTRATION IS RECOMMENDED. SPACE IS LIMITED.
REGISTRATION WILL BE CLOSED FROM AUGUST 24 - SEPTEMBER 2.

Children registered after September 3 will not be permitted to start the program until Monday, September 8. Time is needed to ensure proper staff/child ratios. Beginning September 4, a waiting period of two business days is required before starting the program.

Please note: September is not prorated.

A 10% sibling discount will be applied if you have multiple children in SACC. After you have completed the registration process, please contact Shirley Farquharson at sfarquharson@montclairymca.org within 30 days to receive the discount.

BLOOMFIELD

Children will participate in the School Age Child Care Program at the school they attend during the day. This program is offered in all of the district's elementary schools: Berkeley, Brookdale, Carteret, Demarest, Fairview, Franklin, Oakview, and Watsessing.*

Children must be potty-trained in order to participate in the aftercare program.

Hours of operation are 7:30am to school opening. This program will not operate on days that schools have a delayed opening due to inclement weather or other reasons. Fees are per child.

Program Fees: \$230/month Children can come any number of days in a

month for one price per month.

VERONA

Program Fees: \$230/month

Children can come any number of days in a month for one price per month.

MONTCLAIR

Children will participate in the School Age Child Care Program at the school they attend during the day. This program is offered in all of the district's schools: Bradford, Edgemont, Glenfield, Hillside, Buzz Aldrin, Nishuane, Northeast, The Charles H. Bullock School, Watchung, and the Developmental Learning Center at MCPK (Mini Mountie Students).*

Children must be potty-trained in order to participate in the aftercare program.

BEFORE SCHOOL PROGRAM

This program is offered in all of the district's elementary schools. Hours of operation are 7:30am to school opening. When Montclair schools call a delayed opening due to inclement weather, the Before School Program will have a two hour delay and will begin at 9:30am. Fees are per child.

Program Fees: \$225/month

Children can come any number of days in a month for one price per month.

AFTER SCHOOL PROGRAM

Program begins at school dismissal and children are to be picked up by 6:00pm. On early dismissal days the program will begin at dismissal time. (Times vary according to schools.)
